Thursday, May 4

The first USKBTC Stand-alone Specialty beginning around 3PM in the afternoon. Possible majors! There are no evening activities planned, just time for a great competition and fellowship.

Friday, May 5

The day kicks off with a USKBTC Sweepstakes followed by the second Stand-alone Specialty. A large entry is expected for both the Sweepstakes and the Specialty.

The Centennial Gala will start at approximately 6:30 with a cocktail party and a sit down, served dinner to follow. There will be constantly running slide presentations of both the history of the breed in the United States over the past 100 years as well as a second slide show of all the Kerry Blues in the Centennial Chronicle Publication. The highlight of the Centennial Celebration competition will be the third USKBTC Centennial Sweepstakes and Stand-alone Specialty. The show will include participation ribbons for all Kerry Blues entered and are present, special Centennial medallions for all class placements, Best of Breed, Best of Opposite, Best of Winners, Selects, NOHS, and Awards of Merit. These medallions will only be awarded at the Centennial Show and become a once in a lifetime keepsake for those who earn one. Fittingly, our judge will be Irishman, Harold Quigg.

BARNHUNT begins today and is open to all breeds. Sponsored by the Missouri Canine Athletic Club and the USKBTC. **FCAT** continues on its second day.

Reception Party and Kerries on Parade

Saturday evening will feature a reception/cocktail party in the Checkerboard Café followed by the Kerries on Parade. There will be heavy appetizer's and a cash bar

available. The Parade will take place in the ring outside of the Café.

As each Kerry Blue Terrier enters the ring, a brief note about them will be read.

A goal of the Centennial Celebration is to recognize the role that Kerry Blue Terriers play in our lives... not just in the show ring. The purpose of the Kerries on Parade is to showcase all Kerry Blues whether strictly companions, therapy/service dogs or Kerries participating in dog sports. HISTORY OF THE KERRY BLUE TERRIER IN THE UNITED STATES

THE PRIDE OF OLD KERRY

This material first appeared in the AKC Gazette in May 2022

The rollicking Kerry Blue Terrier celebrates 100 years in the AKC.

From the November 1921 gazette:

"Hereafter a breed of dog known as Kerry Blue Terriers will be admitted to registration and exhibition."

Early in the following year, the AKC registered its first Kerry Blue, *Ch. Brian of Muchia*. We salute the latest member of the AKC's "Century Club" with five (sixth one added) different looks at the breed.

BLUE DOG LEGENDS

David Blake Knox, *The Curious History of Irish Dogs*

The terrier that we now call the Kerry Blue may seem, at first, to have little in common with the dignified and graceful Wolfhound. The ancestors of the humble terrier did not, after all, spend much time in the company of feudal chiefs, princes or kings. They did not lie at their lords' feet during royal banquets, or take part in the ritual of any court's hunting expeditions. Their presence was not sought out by foreign

potentates or diplomats, and they were seldom required to pose for portraits with their masters. The heroic deeds of the Irish Wolfhound are chronicled in the ancient Celtic sagas, but there are few references to the Blue Terrier before the twentieth century.

Nonetheless, the Wolfhound and the Blue Terrier are connected in some unexpected ways, and despite their differences they both came to represent a concept of Ireland—though in different ways, and to different groups of Irish men and women. They also share a propensity to attract romantic myths and legends. In the case of the terrier these usually involve stories in which an exotic blue dog swims ashore from a ship that has foundered in Tralee Bay in County Kerry. At times this is said to be a Spanish galleon, part of the great Armada, struggling to make its way home in heavy seas. In other accounts the ship is a Russian schooner that went down with all hands. Sometimes it is only a modest Portuguese fishing boat.

In all of these stories, the dog that managed to reach the shore soon hooked up with some of the local bitches. Indeed, according to some accounts, he mated with every bitch in Kerry, and the result of his numerous romantic liaisons was the Blue Terrier. Sadly, none of these legends seems to have any basis in reality. Dogs were seldom kept aboard sailing ships, and when they were they were more likely to be water dogs (which could retrieve lines lost overboard or carry messages between ships) and not terriers, a breed that likes to keep its paws firmly planted on dry land. Indeed, the roots of the term 'terrier' are believed to lie in the Latin word 'terram' meaning 'ground.' In any case, the Kerry Blue is clearly related to other Irish terriers such as the Wheaten, from whom the blue dog is probably descended.

In Ireland, Kerries earned the reputation for great courage and intelligence in all forms of field and water work, and for the breed's unusual

color and texture of coat. This created interest in the breed in other European countries. Did you know that Mrs. Casey Hewitt, owner of the Munster prefix, convinced show secretaries to put on classes for this rather rough-looking terrier? She succeeded, and in England at Crufts in 1922, 10 Kerries were benched. Most of them belonged to Mrs. Hewitt. Shortly after, the KBTC of England was formed, and one of its three aims was to popularize the breed at home and abroad. It is reported that the first Kerry litter born in America may have been bred by James McCashin of Morristown, New Jersey, in 1925. It was that same year that the KBTC



of America was formed, with B. Jerome Megargee elected as president. The club's name was later changed to the *United States Kerry Blue Terrier Club*.

Through those early years, Kerries had many enthusiasts promoting the breed. Did you know that Mrs. E.A. Kelly, in a 1939 *Dog World* article, expounded on the reason she preferred a Kerry? She reminded all that you do not have to be Irish to like a Kerry. I especially liked her comment that a Kerry responds to kindness with a depth of affection rarely found in any breed and is devoted to children. "He will guard his home with courage and determination and will lay down his life for his master—and do it with his tail wagging."

There are many wonderful stories told of a Kerry's devotion. A Kerry owned by Jeremiah Leen, of Ireland, in 1924 became great friends with a little girl of 10 who used to deliver milk daily from her home a quarter-mile away. The Kerry would always meet her at the gate, but he never would leave his property. One morning, a bunch of hogs on the road surrounded the little girl and scared her. The Kerry immediately left his property and ran around the little girl, scaring away the hogs in all directions. Of course, he escorted the little girl all the way home.

Another confirmation of a Kerry's devotion to man appeared in a 1936 *Western Kennel World* article. It described a situation of a little boy who

wanted to go swimming. When the Kerry saw the boy in the water and realized that his owner was really not going to do anything about it, the Kerry rushed into the water and pulled the boy to shore. The Kerry then felt it was his responsibility to patrol the beach between the water and any young children until he finally had to be restrained so people were allowed to swim. As you wash, brush, and scissor your Kerry, do you know who changed the style of the first scraggily and unkempt-coated terrier exhibited at shows early in the 20th century to the neater-groomed dog we see today? Mrs. Violet Handy was the lady who started the trend, much to the dismay of many other exhibitors. Well, wouldn't you know that in 1956, Botho Lilienthal stated that nothing in the dog show game can ever be expected to find unanimous approval.

THE ALL-IMPORTANT COAT

AKC breed standard Correct coat is important; it is to be soft, dense and wavy. A harsh, wire or bristle coat should be severely penalized. In show trim the body should be well covered but tidy, with the head (except for the whiskers) and the ears and cheeks clear. Color: Color is important. The correct mature color is any shade of blue gray or gray blue from the deep slate to light blue gray, of a fairly uniform color throughout except that distinctly darker to black parts may appear on the muzzle, head, ears, tail and feet. Kerry color, in its process of "clearing," changes from an apparent black at birth to the mature gray blue or blue gray. The color passes through one or more transitions—involving a very dark blue (darker than deep slate), shades or tinges of brown, and mixtures of these, together with a progressive infiltration of the correct mature color.

GOOD COMPANION

Edwin "Pop" Sayres, *AKC Gazette* (1934)

As a pal, the Kerry blue is hard to beat. Affectionate and devoted, it possesses, in a marked degree, the capacity for attaching itself to one person, and is a dog of strongly individual character. It has a great gift for companionship,



never so happy as when at its master's side. By nature, it is a hardy dog and thrives in a healthy, out-of-door life, with freedom and exercise in plenty. The bitches are excellent mothers and easy whelpers. For some years the breed had a considerable reputation for fighting, and their behavior in the show ring was noisy and disorderly, every dog doing its best to fight with its neighbor. Owing to judicious breeding, this trait has largely disappeared, though gameness and sporting characteristics are unimpaired. The Kerry Blue now lives peacefully with its canine brethren, and it is a quiet and well-disciplined assembly which parades before the judges.

A JUDGE'S NOTES

Seymour Weiss, Just Terriers

In competition, every dog must be moved, and the standard does a good job of describing correct Kerry movement. It is well to remember that the phrase full freedom of action will be encountered in the Movement section of the standard. This is a working terrier that had to get where it was going with no problems. Full freedom of action then is an idea that works. In the normal course of show ring events, many judges will call for two or more dogs to be brought to the middle of the ring for a spar. The

Kerry is definitely a sparring breed, and this should be part of any serious comparison of dogs. But it is important for a judge to know how to orchestrate this. There are few sights more

impressive than Kerries in a spar. What then is the proper way to spar Kerries? The first thing to remember is never to spar more than three dogs at once. You lose the effect, and your ring runs the risk of becoming the scene of chaos. Bring them out close enough to look at each other, close enough to get those ears and that tail where they belong. All the dogs in a spar should stand on their toes on the fine edge of anticipation, but none should open hostilities. The second thing to remember is never to spar dogs and bitches together; that's a recipe for ... Well, just don't ever do it, OK?

MICK: STALLION ON THE LEAD

Here's a thumbnail portrait of the greatest Kerry Blue Terrier of modern times, Ch. Torums Scarf Michael (Mick). Born May 1, 1996, in Liverpool, England to Breeder Ron Ramsey.

Died October 3, 2011, in Acampo, California Owner Marilu Hansen, Handlers Geoff Corish and Michael Coad(United Kingdom); Bill McFadden (United States) Career highlights Top U.K. Terrier 1999; Crufts BIS 2000; Morris & Essex BIS (from the Open Dog class) 2000; Montgomery County Best Terrier in Show 2000, 2001; Top U.S. Dog, All Breeds, 2001; Westminster group wins 2001, 2002, 2003 (BIS); AKC National Championship BIS 2002; 113 all-breed BIS. "My personal favorite moment in Mick's career out of so many was his first weekend out, at Great Western Terrier Association. I had been walking him two miles a day since I got him, just to get used to having a stallion on the lead. As we entered the group ring, under Ken McDermott, I was acutely

aware of both the entire ringside and everyone inside the ring falling under his spell. "He won Group I and BIS from the Open Dog class. He followed this the next day under Lydia Coleman Hutchinson, who was equally smitten. I still remember the way it felt—and I do not have a good memory. It will always be my favorite moment in dogs because having judges fall in love at first sight is such an incredible thing! "For me personally, Mick was a game changer, a once-in-a-lifetime dog. The gift and good luck of having him is something I am reminded of daily."—Bill McFadden

THE VERSATILE KERRY BLUE TERRIER

In *The Curious History of Irish Dogs*, David Blake Knox quotes an Irish farmer who had Kerry Blues in the 1920s: "In the morning they herd the cattle; at noon they come in and tread the wheel to churn the butter; in the afternoon they herd again; and after supper they are turned out to guard the sheep, the chickens and geese and the pigs. "Kerry Blue Terriers have a natural desire to chase, herd, and work. These qualities make them versatile performance dogs, and many Kerry Blue Terrier (KBT) owners, especially those who perform in competitive events. In the past 20 years we have seen more Kerry Blue Terriers competing in a variety of AKC events and certification titles, many after completing conformation titles.

There are many Kerry Blues still receiving additional titles; opportunities to find new ways to demonstrate their amazing versatility. This is no surprise to the long-standing Kerry Blue Terrier fancier, who knows the history behind this amazing breed. AKC titles aside, there are Kerry Blue Terriers in the U.S. who are Therapy dogs, Service/Alert dogs, Farm and Crisis Assistance.

This impressive list of sires and dams that have met or exceeded these criteria is worthy of thoughtful and comprehensive study by the serious student of the breed because it reflects the influence of these dogs on the modern Kerry Blue Terrier. By the same token, many sires and dams, though not Champions themselves, can be just as important through their progeny.

Quality in Kerry Blue Terriers includes conformation, showmanship, color, coat texture and temperament, and in our great sires and · it goes further, for they must possess the ability to produce this “quality” in their progeny. “Quality” must be evident in several generations if it is consistently reproduced.







A BIT ABOUT KERRY BLUE TERRIERS

The exact origins of the Kerry Blue Terrier are lost in the mists of time, but any Kerry owner can tell you there were both fairies and blarney involved in the process. One hundred years ago the AKC recognized the Kerry Blue Terrier in 1922 and what a ride it has been! Since that time the evolution of the Kerry is well documented in photographs from the first dogs to the modern Kerry we have today, but they have retained much of their natural traits which makes them the exciting breed that they are.

A Kerry can be mischievous, adventurous and intelligent dogs that are able to do all types of activities, or have down time next to their owner. You may see them in the conformation ring, agility, obedience and all other performance areas. They were bred as an all-around farm dog and they still herd sheep, and some work on farms with different types of animals. When socialized from an early age they can get along with other dogs as well as other animals. They also have a mind of their own so they need a firm but gentle hand to guide them in the right direction.

A Kerry is an elegant dog with substance; he should be upstanding and well knit with proper balance in a muscular body. He is a



dog that flows when he gaits, not a restricted or high stepping gait, and he should be balanced in both the front and rear. The coat is soft, dense and wavy, and the beautiful blue color is a hallmark of the breed. He has a look that announces that he is a very proud and noble breed. And just then he remembers how much fun life is and turns into a clown, which will keep you smiling and quick in your step.

When born, Kerries are little black bundles of joy, but as they mature into adulthood they change to a shade of blue/gray anywhere from a deep slate blue to a lighter silver blue, part of the adventure of owning a Kerry is to see as they age what color they will finally become.

Kerries are comfortable on a farm, in the suburbs or in a high rise in Chicago. They are very adaptable and will do anything for their owners. They are a breed that needs a stable environment and an owner that is willing to put some time into this wonderful breed. They need a job to keep them happy, whether it's working in performance or watching over the children as they play.

When you live with a Kerry Blue Terrier they will make you laugh every day; they are amazing wondrous creatures that get into your soul and hold you captive. At times they might challenge your decisions, but they are also a loyal dog that will be your best friend throughout their life. People that live with a Kerry understand that there may well be a bit of a leprechaun in them!

We continued training with Judy Vanderford, AKC Herding judge and started with AHBA trials. In 2006 we (USKBTC) petitioned AKC to allow the Kerry blue terrier to obtain AKC Herding titles. We received immediate approval, thanks to Carl Ashby, the late Bob Nazak and our herding committee. We trained every week in the Angeles Forest, a six-hour RT drive in LA traffic for 2 ½ years. 



The Centennial of the Kerry Blue Terrier's recognition by the American Kennel Club seemed like the perfect time to share some of the special Kerry Blues we have had the privilege of breeding and showing over the years. We hope you enjoy a bit of the history of Blujac Kerry Blue Terriers.

It started when we attended the Asheville North Carolina Kennel Club Dog show with our Scottie, Baxter. At that show we saw a Kerry Blue Terrier bred and shown by Margo Steinman. After several months,

including visiting her in Oak Ridge, TN a ten month Kerry Blue bitch was acquired. Her name was Kilmarley Irish Imp.

Penny was an "old fashioned" bitch with great refinement and extraordinary movement. Margo's advice was to finish each dog with at least one specialty major and we were determined to finish Penny with that coveted win. She won 3 majors, 2 on the Westchester weekend taking Best of Winners at the Empire Specialty. Jaimie next pursued obedience with her and obtained her CDX. Ch Kilmarley Irish Imp, CDX was our foundation bitch, and her legacy has had a profound impact on the Blujac breeding program.



BLUJAC KERRY BLUE TERRIERS



A once in a lifetime dog – Ch. Blujacs Afternoon Delight ROM. It was time to breed Penny and Margo recommended CH Kavanaugh's Intimidator who was sired by Ch. Tontines Something Else. We took her advice, and the result was one of the top winning breeder-owner-handled dogs in the history of the breed. Del finished his championship at the Southern California Great Western Specialty under Anne Clark which, at the time, was the largest specialty in the country and arguably the best competition.

Del won multiple Best in Shows and won or placed in over 75% of the Groups in which he competed and has numerous champions to his record. His famous "kick" when he started to move made him a pleasure to watch as he moved around the ring. Del never disappointed and he was not only a great show dog he was a great house dog making the moves with us as we moved around the country. Del is found in many of the pedigrees of the top kennels in the country. Fortunately, we had been around long enough to know that he was truly a "once in a lifetime dog". Proudly he was owner handled his entire show career.



BLUJAC KERRY BLUE TERRIERS



Ch. Blujacs Afternoon Delight sired numerous litters but the most memorable was a dog he produced named Machavens Baron of Blujac. He finished with specialty majors and won or placed in multiple groups. On a lovely weekend of show Del won Best in Show on Saturday and his son, Mac, went Best in Show the next day. To our knowledge this was the first time (and maybe the only time) an owner-handler had gone Best in Show on consecutive days with two different dogs of the same breed. Mac went on to also sire champions and lived out his life as a wonderful companion.

During the 1980s we bred on a limited basis with all of our Kerry Blues finishing with multiple Specialty majors.

CH Blujac's Irish Dream (Bailey) was the next outstanding Kerry from our breeding program. She finished with all Specialty majors including winning Best of Breed from the classes at the Philadelphia Kerry Blue Terrier Club Specialty and repeated Best of Breed the next year. Bailey became a therapy dog and enjoyed the run of the house until her death at 17.

Perhaps one of our most special dogs has been Ch. Blujac's American Beauty (Ch. Everglory's Ironclad x Ch Blujacs Irish Mist). Sometimes a dog comes along that will never be a top winning special but always does her breeder and the breed proud. Squiggy was such a Kerry! We pushed her young, went home disappointed, but never lost faith in her quality. Squiggy didn't either and she rewarded us with 3 specialty majors including Best of Opposite Sex at Montgomery County from the classes under a breeder judge. She was bred to Ch. Kallehan's Truth or Dare which brought Ch. Torum's Scarf Michael into our breeding program. Squiggy served many years as a therapy dog. She lived a long and happy life, and we miss her every day.


BLUJAC KERRY BLUE TERRIERS

THE PERFORMANCE KERRY BLUE TERRIER



The Kerry Blue Terrier ~ the breed that has captured all of our hearts ~ is truly multi-talented. And we don't need to tell you that Kerries are so much more than show dogs. Amenable and eager to please, Kerries excel in numerous performance events from the agility ring to therapy dog work in multiple settings and venues. And when all is said and done, they can truly relax as snuggly couch potatoes and take more than their share of the bed!

Quite a few breeders encourage their puppy buyers to start off on the right foot with basic obedience classes, and we would definitely echo that advice. Learning the basics of “down”, “sit”, “heel”, “stay”, “come”, walking politely on leash and so many more gives your dog skills that make day-to-day life easier for everyone. In addition to learning basic manners, obedience training may also open up more doors in public places for you and your dog. Plus your dog feels more secure because he knows the rules. And as with numerous other activities, you build a bond with your Kerry during the learning process. As with other activities, there are multiple advanced levels to work toward.

For many, Agility is the performance event of choice for both dog and owner. With numerous levels that get more and more challenging, this event can be ideal for the high energy dog. Learning intricate courses together can truly help build and strengthen the bond between dog and owner alike, and the high activity level is an added bonus for both.

Bred to be an all-around working farm dog, it should not be surprising that the Kerry often excels in Barn Hunt. Utilizing hay bales to create tunneling and climbing opportunities, barn hunt tests the Kerries scenting ability as they search for hidden tubes (empty, litter and litter/live rat). Many would say that it also tests the owner's ability to partner with their dog and learn its signal for a find. Each successive level gets more difficult, with more complicated tunnels, climbing and hides. It's definitely a challenge that many dogs enjoy!



Nose work is another great sport, started on the West Coast in 2006 by three experienced professional explosives and narcotic detection dog trainers. Requiring much less equipment than other performance events, many owners begin training by hiding tidbits of their Kerries favorite high value treat in boxes around the house and encouraging them to search. From simple beginnings at home to searches outside and in public places that welcome dogs, the hides get harder and are frequently hidden in elevated places. Fans of Nose Work report that it often calms the energetic dog, builds confidence in the shy dog and is perhaps the only dog sport that welcomes and makes accommodations for dogs that are reactive. Dogs are worked one at a time in the search area, allowing each dog to focus on the task and the handler to focus on the dog.

It may come as a surprise to many, but in 2006 the USKBTC petitioned AKC to allow the Kerry Blue Terrier to obtain AKC Herding titles. We received immediate approval, thanks to Carl Ashby, the late Bob Nazak and our herding committee, with petition passing on the first vote. Sadly, finding herding instinct testing can be challenging for many, but owners say that there are few greater thrills for an owner than to

witness the joy in their dog's eyes when that ancient instinct is triggered. We would be remiss if we failed to note that the first Kerry ~ and the first terrier of any breed ~ to earn a herding title was CH Warlord's Scarf Mackenzie, in 2007. And following in Mackenzie's footsteps, GCH Topgun Great Balls of Fire ~ “Smokey” ~ excelled at herding livestock. He is the only terrier to date to earn advance titles in AKC Herding, Australian Shepherd Club of America (ASCA) Herding, and the American Herding Breed Association (AHBA) earning over 30 herding titles in all.

Another very worthwhile activity numerous Kerry owners around the country participate in is Therapy Dog work. “Therapy dogs are classified as dogs who go with their owners to volunteer in settings such as schools, hospitals, nursing homes and more. From working with a child who is learning to read to visiting a senior in assisted living, therapy dogs and their owners work together as a team to improve the lives of other people.” In recent years, therapy dogs have also been welcomed to visit police departments and fire stations in addition to also participating in Animal Assisted Crisis Response which is mobilized in response to wildfires, mudslides and various natural disasters. And the best part of all is that a well-socialized dog can become active in these activities regardless of whether or not they are show dogs. That's a win-win for Kerry blue terriers around the country!

This is just a brief list of the many options for getting out there and being active with your Kerry blue terrier, and for showcasing the breed to the public. THE KERRY BLUE TERRIER STANDARD

GENERAL APPEARANCE

The typical Kerry Blue Terrier should be upstanding well knit and in good balance, showing a well-developed and muscular body with definite terrier style and character throughout. Correct coat and color are important. A low-slung Kerry is not typical.

SIZE, PROPORTION, SUBSTANCE

The ideal Kerry should be 18 1/2 inches at the withers for a dog, slightly less for a bitch. In judging Kerries, a height of 18-19 1/2 inches for a dog, and 17 1/2-19 inches for a bitch, should be given primary preference. Only where the comparative superiority of a specimen outside of the ranges noted clearly justifies it should greater latitude be taken. In no case should it extend to a dog over 20 inches or under 17 1/2 inches, or to a bitch over 19 1/2 inches or under 17 inches. The minimum limits do not apply to puppies. The most desirable weight for a fully developed dog is from 33-40 pounds, bitches weighing proportionately less. A well-developed and muscular body. Legs moderately long with plenty of bone and muscle.

HEAD

Long, but not exaggerated, and in good proportion to the rest of the body. Well balanced. Eyes-Dark, small, not prominent, well placed and with a keen terrier expression. Anything approaching a yellow eye is very undesirable. Ears-V-shaped, small but not out of proportion to the size of the dog, of moderate thickness, carried forward close to the cheeks with the top of the folded ear slightly above the level of the skull. A “dead” ear, houndlike in appearance, is very undesirable. Skull-Flat, with very slight stop, of but moderate breadth between the ears,

and narrowing very slightly to the eyes. Foreface full and well made up, not falling away appreciably below the eyes but moderately chiseled out to relieve the foreface from wedginess. Little apparent difference between the length of the skull and foreface. Jaws deep, strong and muscular. Cheeks-Clean and level, free from bumpiness. Nose-Black, nostrils large and wide. Teeth-Strong, white and either level or with the upper (incisors) teeth slightly overlapping the lower teeth. An undershot mouth should be strictly penalized.

NECK, TOPLINE, BODY

Neck-Clean and moderately long, gradually widening to the shoulders upon which it should be well set and carried proudly. Back short, strong and straight (i.e., level), with no appearance of slackness. Chest deep and of moderate breadth. Ribs fairly well sprung, deep rather than round. A slight tuck-up. Loin short and powerful. Tail should be set on high, of moderate length and carried gaily erect, the straighter the tail the better.



FOREQUARTERS

Shoulders fine, long and sloping, well laid back and well knit. The elbows hanging perpendicularly to the body and working clear of the side in movement. The forelegs should be straight from both front and side view. The pasterns short, straight and hardly noticeable. Feet should be strong, compact, fairly round and moderately small, with good depth of pad free from cracks, the toes arched, turned neither in nor out, with black toenails.



HINDQUARTERS

Strong and muscular with full freedom of action, free from droop or crouch, the thighs long and powerful, stifles well bent and turned neither in nor out, hocks near the ground and, when viewed from behind, upright and parallel with each other, the dog standing well up on them.

COAT

Correct coat is important. It is to be soft, dense and wavy. A harsh, wire or bristle coat should be severely penalized. In show trim the body should be well covered but tidy, with the head (except for the whiskers) and the ears and cheeks clear.

COLOR

Color is important. The correct mature color is any shade of blue gray or gray blue from the deep slate to light blue gray, of a fairly uniform color throughout except that distinctly darker to black parts may appear on the muzzle, head, ears, tail and feet. Kerry color, in its process of “clearing” changes from an apparent black at birth to the mature gray blue or blue gray. The color passes through one or more transitions-involving a very dark blue (darker

than deep slate), shades or tinges of brown, and mixtures of these, together with a progressive infiltration of the correct mature color. The time needed for this “clearing” process varies with each dog. Small white markings are permissible. Black on the muzzle, head, ears, tail and feet is permissible at any age. A black dog 18 months of age or older is never permissible in the show ring and is to be disqualified.

DISQUALIFICATION:
A black dog 18 months of age or older is to be disqualified. White markings on a black dog 18 months of age or older does not constitute clearing or mature color and the dog is to be disqualified.

GAIT

Full freedom of action. The elbows hanging perpendicularly to the body and working clear of the sides in movement; both forelegs and hind legs should move straight forward when traveling, the stifles turning neither in nor out.

IT IS A TRUISM THAT ANATOMICAL STRUCTURE IS THE MOST IMPORTANT AND LEAST VARIABLE COMPONENT DETERMINING HOW A DOG, OR ANY OTHER ANIMAL, MOVES. OTHER FACTORS ARE TEMPERAMENT, SPEED, TERRAIN AND GENERAL VITALITY.

Since the Kerry Blue Terrier was bred as a working terrier in Ireland, he obviously had to be sturdy and display great stamina as he went about his many duties. In order to conserve his energy, an economy and freedom of motion are essential. This economy of available energy can only be obtained if the animal is properly

structured and properly conditioned. Any structural faults, which result in a labored gait, will waste energy, causing the dog to fatigue quickly and eventually lead to physical breakdown.

What is the desired anatomical structure for the Kerry Blue Terrier, and how do we evaluate the individual dog to see how closely he approaches the ideal in structure and function?


Structure and function are directly related and best correlated in the show ring by an observation of how the dog moves at various speeds. The most useful gait for evaluation is the trot, which may vary somewhat in speed. If the dog is gaited too slowly; it may lapse into a walk or unsightly amble. If gaited too fast, the dog may canter or gallop.

There is very little in the Official American Standard of the Kerry Blue Terrier to help us in the evaluation of gait, although it is fairly specific in defining structure. We must first understand the anatomical structure, and then study its effect on movement. Improper structure will inevitably be reflected by improper movement.

One of the often poorly understood questions is that of measurement for height and length. Height is a vertical measurement from the surface on which the dog stands to the top of the withers. Withers as applied to anatomy is defined by Webster's Third New International Dictionary as "a. the ridge between the shoulder bones of the horse and b. the part between the shoulder bones at the base of the neck in various animals." This corresponds to the prominent spinous process of the first thoracic vertebra. It can be felt beteen the tops of the scapulae, or shoulder blades, just back of a depression at the base of the neck. To get an accurate measurement the dog must be positioned with the forelegs straight under the shoulder blades, and the head and neck elevated in a natural stance. The head and neck must not be depressed to attempt to make the dog measure shorter, or pulled up to make the dog measure taller. Length is measured from the forward tip of the sternum, or breastbone, to the most distant prominence of the pelvis, below and to each side of the tail.



► The dog should be approximately as high as it is long.

If he is too short in length the hind feet and forefeet are apt to get in each other's way when moving in the trot. Also if too short in length, the dog is apt to have a "tight coupling" from withers to pelvis, meaning he will lack flexibility through the loin and pelvis creating a stilted, bouncy rear end, and he will not turn easily to the side.

The next consideration is the concept of “layback”. Layback is the angle at which the scapula, or shoulder blade, lies on the thorax, or upper body. A proper layback is important to allow freedom of motion and good forward reach of the foreleg. Proper shoulder layback approaches 45 degrees, although few specimens achieve this. A 45 degree layback means that the angle formed from the more forward and lower part of the scapula, at the shoulder joint, to the upper prominence of the scapulae at the withers, measures 45 degrees from the vertical and from the horizontal. This can be judged by laying the index finger along the ridge formed by the spine of the scapula, in which case it should be a line half way between vertical and horizontal. Another approximation can be gained by observing the relation of the prominence of the scapulae at the withers to the forward prominence of the shoulder joint.

The scapula should lie flat against the thorax and glide easily over the thorax on motion, without any “winging” or displacement from a close coaption to the thorax. The upper bone of the foreleg joins the scapula at a backward angle equal to the scapular layback angle, thus balancing the two bones and placing the rest of the foreleg straight under the tip of the scapula at the withers. This creates a flexible coupling of the front leg assembly to the body. This whole assembly is attached to the body solely by muscles and ligaments. Excess stresses will lead to either “loaded shoulders” with heavy muscular development or overstretching and weakening the musculature accompanied by “winging” of the

scapula. The major cause of excess stress on the fore assembly is the straight or “steep” shoulder, meaning that the scapular layback is too vertical. This leads to limited forward reach and pounding of the forefoot. The straight shoulder also diminishes apparent length of the neck.

It is important to watch the fore assembly in motion. Along with proper layback the chest must not be too narrow or too wide. If too narrow, the shoulders will be pinched, resulting in a paddling type gait in which the foreleg swings in a somewhat lateral motion. If the chest is too wide, the dog will be apt to move the elbow outward in a partially circular manner which is wasteful of energy, uncoordinated and clumsy. As a working terrier, a wide chest also makes it difficult to “go to ground” for burrowing animals.

A dog with proper structure will lift and reach straightforward with the foreleg, the foot swinging fairly close to the ground. This covers the maximum amount of ground with the least effort. As the foot strikes the pastern flexes to absorb the shock and the toes grasp the surface to break what in reality is a forward, falling motion provided by the propulsion of the rear. Good feet are important and often overlooked. This forward propulsion continues with the reaching foreleg drawing back and “pulling in the ground”.

This action in front is coordinated with the rear, which is our next consideration. In order to provide proper drive, once again proper structure of bone, joint and muscle is necessary. The pelvis

should be slightly flexed and joined to the body by a flexible loin. With a properly flexed pelvis, the ischial tuberosities or “pin bones” will be prominent in the dog’s rear end. The upper thighbone is somewhat flexed forward and an angle is formed at the stifle by the backward flexed “second thigh” leading to the “well let down” back and rear pastern where another angle is formed. This combination of angles places the weight borne by the rear directly over the hind foot in natural stance. A straight stifle limits motion and flexibility. The usual “stacked” show stance places the rear weight slightly ahead of the rear foot.

Motion in the rear must be straight forward and back, the hocks turned neither in nor out. Forward reach in the rear must equal forward reach in front. If reach is greater in the rear than a straight fronted dog can accomplish in front, a delaying tactic to achieve coordination between front and rear is a “hacking” gait in front. This is stylistic, but not proper, and wastes considerable energy, as well as limiting forward reach.

There is widespread misconception about the amount of backward push or drive, which is desirable. The drive must be sufficient to propel the dog forward in a smooth, level manner, with sufficient momentum to vault the body over the forward reaching foreleg. The strike of the rear foot at the end of forward reach is followed by a strong push off in which the foot is only momentarily on the ground. Any overextension of backward motion once the rear foot has left the ground is wasted motion. It usually accompanies limited forward reach of the rear leg and places the

strike point of the foot too far back, which limits the ability of the dog to readily change direction since his weight is not well centered over the foot. This results in extra strain on rear musculature and early fatigue. Also a lowering of the dog’s body is noticeable as he moves forward at speed.

An appreciation of the foregoing is necessary to evaluate a specimen of our breed. It is all too easy for an exhibitor or handler to hide many of a dog’s structural faults by a skillful trim of the coat. However, the knowledgeable and observant ringsider, who can’t put his hands on the dog, will not be fooled once he sees the dog move.
